Let's Enjoy Camping!

Did you know that there are low-cost campsites and accommodations available in the suburbs of Morioka? Let's enjoy the beautiful nature in Iwate, making use of these facilities.

♦ Morioka-shi Sotoyama Shinrin Koen

(Yabukawa, Tamayama Village)

This park has a camping area, walking trails in the woods, a charcoal kiln and a mushroom field where you can have hands-on experiences in forest industry. It also has an observation deck that offers a great view of the ocean of trees, an obstacle course in the woods, facilities to be used on rainy days, and a restaurant where you can taste delicious hand-made soba (buckwheat) noodles.



Open from 9:00 to 16:00 from April 29

through October 31, and closed on Tuesdays. If a Tuesday falls on a national holiday, the park is closed on the following Thursday instead.

The camping area is available from July 1 through August 31, during which period the park is open every day. Reservations for the camping area are handled on and after May 1.

[Rental Fees] Tent for 8 people: ¥500 Tent for 5 people: ¥300

Cooking utensils are also available to rent.

♦ Kuzakai Kogen Shonen Shizen-no Ie (2-111, Tashiro, Kawai Village)

Shonen Shizen-no Ie is located at the foot of Mt. Kabuto, 700 meters northeast of Kuzakai Station, JR Yamada Line. It was opened in 1945 and has been used for group outdoor activities such as hiking and camping. It accommodates 278 people in the tents and 200 in the lodge. Groups of school children, families and other groups can use the facilities. Accommodation is available for a group of three people or more, the restaurant for five people or more. Fee: ¥1,800 per person (overnight stay, three meals are provided). Other arrangements are available. Closed on Mondays. Make reservations by phone or other means one month before you come, giving information on your schedule and number of people.

◆ Tonan Tusdoi no Mori (1-88, Yuzawa, Morioka)

Located in the southwest part of Morioka, Tsudoi no Mori offers an attractive natural environment. It is also popular as a treasure house of wild birds. You can see pretty wild birds that are rarely seen. Tsudoi no Mori has a camping area, walking trails, bungalows, cabins, barbecue houses, tennis courts, gateball fields and a craft center (Shinrin Sousaku Jisshuu-kan) where you can make wooden crafts.

Open from 8:30 to 17:00 all year (The camping area is available from June 1 through September 30.) Reservations for the camping area are accepted on and after May 1.
